

FATIMA NEWS ORDINARY 12th & 13th Sundays - 23 June 2024 TIME

Greetings to all,

In the Gospel reading of this Sunday, we listen to the story of Jesus returning to his hometown Nazareth, the town people only recognize him as the son of the carpenter, whose mother, Mary, and whose brothers and sisters are known to them.

He is one of their own, just like themselves. Yet, in other ways he is not like themselves. The townspeople of Nazareth are astonished at his wisdom and his miraculous powers. They wonder where he could have got all that from. They were mystified by him.




This is the fundamental mystery of Jesus. He was like us in every way, except sin; he was fully human and, yet, there was more to him than that. There was a divine wisdom and power at work within him. The fourth evangelist, John, expressed that mystery of Jesus very succinctly when he said at the beginning of his gospel that the Word who was God became flesh.

He was 'flesh' like all of us, fully human, the son of a carpenter, from a particular place in Galilee who lived at a particular time in history. Yet, his flesh revealed God in a unique way. This is the scandal of the incarnation that so disturbed the people of Nazareth. God came to us in the ordinary, the familiar, in the life of a carpenter's son.

That son of the carpenter, that son of Mary who is also Son of God, continues to come to us today as risen Lord in and through the familiar and the ordinary. He said to his disciples, 'whoever welcomes you, welcomes me', 'whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me' and 'just as you did it to one of the least of these, you did it to me'.

We are being reminded that the sacred and the secular are not all that far apart; we encounter the sacred in the secular, the divine in the human. We are always on holy ground. Have a blessed weekend,

NAIDOC WEEK BEGINS ON SUNDAY, 7 JULY. This week provides an opportunity for all Australians to join in celebrating the culture, aspirations and hopes of the country's First Nations peoples.

SACRISTANS AND SERVERS

Many people arriving for Mass would be unaware of the effort that goes into preparing the worship environment and the items needed for the celebration. The 'behind the scenes' ministry of sacristans is an essential service to the worshipping assembly. Sacristans take responsibility for opening up the church, turning on lights and microphones, putting out the Roman Missal (prayer book) and Lectionary (book of scripture readings) - both marked at the right place of course! - and setting out chalices, plates, cruets, bread and wine, so that Mass can be celebrated.

The fundamental contribution of servers is to facilitate a smooth liturgy by anticipating the needs of the presider and other members of the assembly, leading the way where necessary, yet rarely being noticed themselves. This requires self-discipline and forethought so that unnecessary movement can be avoided. It is important that the servers be neatly attired and move with confidence and grace in order to contribute to the prayerful atmosphere of the liturgy. Sacristans and servers need to understand the order of the liturgy and about the sacred vestments and vessels used in liturgy.

They put themselves at the service of the community and its worship and so help the liturgy become truly an act of worship and thanksgiving for all. - *Elizabeth Harrington*


